Day One – Heroines of the Capital

Arrive in Washington, DC, and begin your journey with visits to the Clara Barton Missing Soldiers Office, the DAR Museum, and the National Woman's Party at the Belmont-Paul Women's Equality National Monument. Learn how women shaped our early republic before enjoying a warm Colonial Feast & meeting Martha Washington at a local tavern. Overnight in Virginia.

Day Two – Women of Alexandria

After breakfast, travel back in time at Mount Vernon, home of Martha Washington. Spend the afternoon exploring the cobblestone streets of Old Town Alexandria with a Colonial Guide who will share the stories of the women who built this port town. Visit landmarks like Gadsby's Tavern, Christ Church, and the Torpedo Factory Art Center. Dinner tonight is at a popular local favorite.

Day Three – Trailblazing Women of Virginia

Visit the Lucy Burns Museum, housed in a former prison where suffragists were jailed and force-fed in 1917. Enjoy time to explore the riverside town of Occoquan before continuing to Fredericksburg for visits to Kenmore, Mary Washington House, and George Washington's boyhood home, Ferry Farm. Dine in a historic tavern steeped in Revolutionary and Civil War history before continuing to Richmond.

Day Four – Richmond to Revolution

This morning's Richmond City Tour highlights the Voices from the Garden women's monument & the life of trailblazer Maggie L. Walker. Then head to Jamestown to learn the true story of Pocahontas. After checking into your Williamsburg-area hotel, enjoy dinner at a historic tavern once frequented by the colony's revolutionary thinkers – and run by a successful widow, Christiana Campbell.

Day Five – Colonial Women Come to Life

Spend the day immersed in Colonial Williamsburg's "Women at Work" experience, discovering the roles and resilience of 18th-century women. Enjoy time for lunch, exploration, and shopping before concluding your tour with a visit to the American Revolution Museum at Yorktown – where the stories of women's wartime contributions bring history to life. Then, begin your journey home.

Walk in the footsteps of the women who shaped a nation.

From revolutionaries to reformers, discover the untold stories of America's founding mothers, suffragists, and everyday heroines on this inspiring journey through history.
