Sample Itinerary

Day 1 - Wednesday, July 1, 2026 | Welcome to the Nation's Capital

Your patriotic journey begins as you arrive in Washington, DC to celebrate America's 250th Birthday! Step inside the National Archives to see the original Declaration of Independence, Constitution, and Bill of Rights before embarking on a guided tour of the city's most iconic monuments and memorials. Day 2 - Thursday, July 2, 2026 | George Washington's World

Step inside historic Christ Church, where the Washingtons once worshipped, and tour Gadsby's Tavern, a favorite gathering place of America's founders. Then, dive into culture at the Smithsonian Museums and the Smithsonian Folklife Festival, one of DC's most beloved summer traditions. After dinner at a local favorite, end your evening under the stars at the powerful WWII Memorial and with sweeping city views from the Kennedy Center terrace.

Day 4 - Saturday, July 4, 2026 | A Historic Fourth of July

Make a final stop at The Lincoln Memorial Undercroft is a 15,000-square-foot, formerly inaccessible cavernous space beneath the memorial that is being transformed into an immersive museum, slated to open July 4, 2026 for the 250th anniversary of American independence. The space will feature interactive, multimedia exhibits, a theater, and views of the memorial's original foundation, and its role as an international icon dedicated to the achievements of Abraham Lincoln and individuals such as Marian Anderson and Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., who have shaped the history of the memorial. After, you'll bid farewell to Washington, DC – departing with new friends, treasured memories, and the pride of having celebrated America's 250th birthday in the very heart of it all.
